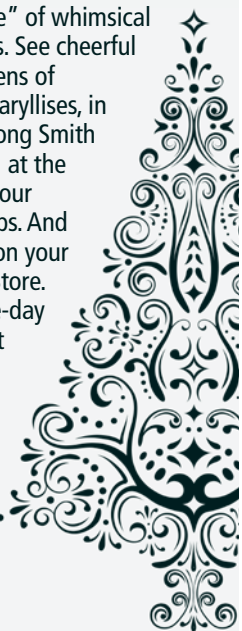
The Garden's annual WinterShow is a Cleveland holiday tradition, and this year will be a dazzler.

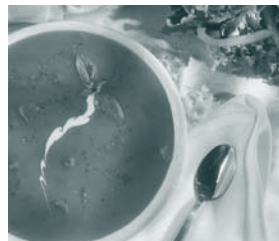

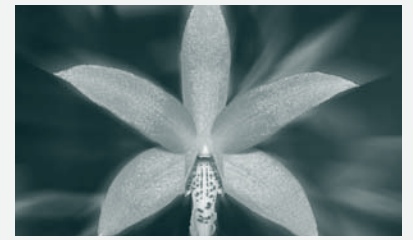
